Description

What are the different ways that the humanities and social sciences, scientific research, and community organizations are beginning to explore how multiple social identities—such as race, disability, gender, sexuality, and social class—shape human bodies and human experience? How can a focus on the intersections of social identity help us understand and influence the social, political, and economic structures in which we live?

CRITICAL JUNCTURE is a conference that seeks to foster discourse on identity, difference and inequality from a variety of cross-disciplinary and interdisciplinary perspectives. This conference invites engaged participation of researchers, scholars, community artists, and organizers whose work focuses on the impact of the relationship between social identities and the contexts within which they form. In particular, we will explore the interstices of identity and inequality that bring people into contact with institutional and cultural power in particular social spaces (e.g. workplaces, 'public' spaces, state institutions, educational systems, local and global economies, and health systems).

The conference will include keynote addresses from scholars central to intersectional theory and analysis, including disability studies scholar Nirmala Erevelles, author of *Disability and Difference in Global Contexts: Enabling a Transformative Body Politic*. In addition, a diverse group of Emory University faculty, including Rosemarie Garland-Thomson, Sander Gilman, and Benjamin Reiss will serve as panel discussants.
