Participants may submit a maximum of two abstracts where they are the first author or presenter. There is no maximum number of submissions on which a participant may be a co-author. See conference website for full guidelines.

Conference Details

Our theme of "Bridging Intercultural Divides in a Digitally Interconnected World" highlights the importance of coming together across disciplines, traditions, and geographic regions to address issues of cultural diversity and intercultural relations in an increasing digitally connected, but also an increasingly divided world. We accept multidisciplinary submissions (e.g., psychology, education, business, health science, communication, social science) of research that fall into the broad conference topics.

Conference Topics

Contemporary Global Challenges

The impact and influence of complex international issues facing humanity; e.g. digital technologies, climate change, sustainability, and future uncertainty.

Culture, Minority groups, and Inequality

Research and practice related to and led by Indigenous peoples and marginalised or minority groups as well as topics concerning power and inequity, decolonisation, discrimination, prejudice, and human rights.

Applied Cultural Research and Practice

Applications of cultural research and theory to work (business, organisations, leadership), therapeutic settings (clinical psychology, counselling, social work, nursing/medicine), education, communication, policymaking.

Pathways and Outcomes of Migration for Diverse Peoples

Processes, outcomes, and contexts of acculturation and adaptation among migrants, refugees and asylum seekers, international students as well as issues of societal multiculturalism and diversity.

Health and Development + Other

Experiences of cultural socialisation and health across the life-span, family and interpersonal relationships. Other submissions with topics related to intercultural relations and cross-cultural psychology are also invited.
